UNITED WAY CAPITAL AREA AND GREENLIGHTS FOR NONPROFIT SUCCESS, PARTNER TO SURVEY LOCAL NONPROFITS

AUSTIN, Texas – United Way Capital Area (UWCA) and Greenlights for NonProfit Success (Greenlights) today launched a survey that takes aims to take the pulse of the local nonprofit sector.

The survey will be sent Monday July 27, to more than 1,100 senior nonprofit executives in Central Texas, who will be invited to complete the short online survey on behalf of their respective organizations.

The purpose of the study is to find out how nonprofit organizations are faring in this current economic climate, and provide valuable insight to increase awareness of any issues, and encourage more advocacy and financial support for the sector as a whole.

Debbie Bresette, interim President and CPO of UWCA, said “we are partnering with Greenlights on this important study, as both organizations felt it was necessary to take a close look at how all nonprofits are coping in this difficult economic climate. Having these results will identify specific areas where help is needed, and hopefully spur more investment and available resources for all Central Texas nonprofits.”

Matt Kouri, Executive Director of Greenlights, added “we’ve experienced a significant increase in calls from foundations, donors and the media wanting to know how the nonprofits we serve are being impacted. Hence we decided to go beyond anecdotes to collecting hard data.”

The study will be open to any nonprofit organization from Monday July 27 through Friday August 7. The findings, which will be anonymous, will be published and made available later in August.
